We are most fortunate that the transition to a regional and democratic form of organization has avoided this pitfall. Credit must go to the many individuals throughout the IIBA who, since 1996, have worked hard to bring this about.

As I am most familiar with the work of the last Board of Trustees (BOT), I would like to pay tribute to Scott Baum, our President for the last six years and the BOT members who worked with him. Unless you have had the privilege of knowing these people personally, you will not know the amount of committed hard work, freely given – even in the face of sustained personal losses of partners, family or personal health – to advance the well-being of the IIBA on your behalf, so that it stays a living, international organization that can sustain us all. Therefore, on your behalf, I extend a simple but heartfelt THANK YOU.

One of the key challenges for the new BOT is to build on the Strategic Plan developed by the previous BOT, and to encourage the connections between grass-roots members of the IIBA. This is done primarily through your involvement in your local Society, through participating in the election of regional reps to the BOT, through attending IIBA conferences and regional training workshops, and through developing an awareness that the IIBA is YOU.

To support this process, the BOT is inviting local Societies to consider how they can enhance the knowledge and spread of Bioenergetic Analysis. To this end, the BOT has established an Annual Project Fund, whereby 15% of the annual fees paid to the IIBA by your Society can be applied for. This fund is about supporting the growth of Bioenergetic Analysis in your locality, or in your country with other societies, or on a regional basis. A simple Application Form is available from our Administrator at iiba.spain@bioenergeticanalysis.com. Applicants will also be asked to provide a brief report at the end of the calendar year, so that the BOT can evaluate this program and share good ideas with member Societies.

Another way to share what is happening in your Society is by posting photos, messages, and likes, on our Facebook page <IIBA (International Institute for Bioenergetic Analysis)> which is managed by our Administrator, Pilar Llobregat in Barcelona. You can also access the IIBA website at www.bioenergetic-therapy.com that contains a wealth of information and resources about the IIBA. The Communications Committee of the new BOT is also working to keep you informed about what is happening as is Michael Brennan the editor of our annual Newsletter. Your contributions to the Newsletter are also a way of strengthening the connections between us all in the IIBA.

It is 30 years, this Spring, since the first volume of 'The Clinical Journal of the IIBA' was published in 1984. In the Guest Editorial, Alexander Lowen noted that most journals of this type fail and that, "while we are limited for financial reasons, to publishing in English, we hope that some day we can publish articles in the writer's native language with an English translation. With your cooperation we can realize our hopes." The Journal has flourished for 30 years, thanks to the work of its many editors and contributors, and I hope you notice in the report from the Communications Committee, that Alexander Lowen's hopes are finally coming to fruition in regard to translations of the Journal. A Portuguese edition will be printed in 2015 to coincide with the IIBA Conference in Recife, Brazil. The Journal will then be printed in each of the major languages of the IIBA on a rotational basis.

And last but not least, start saving your money so that you can attend the exciting IIBA Conference in Recife, Brazil in August 2015 on the theme of love in the therapeutic relationship. A great place and theme for us to meet, work and dance together!

It is humbling to be elected President of the IIBA and I can only meet the demands of this position with the support of my fellow BOT members, the Faculty members, and you the members of the IIBA.

The ex-officio (old) BOT members who have remained to help in the transition for one year and who are not voting in the new BOT are: **Scott Baum** as past president for Faculty, **Fina Pla** for Europe, **Barbara Middleton** for North America and New Zealand and **Mae Nascimento** for South America.

This board will keep working together to advance the initiatives of the IIBA matters, policies and decisions. It has elected **Garry Cockburn** as President, **Claudia Ucros** as Vice- President and **Ana-Lucia Faria** as Secretary. The new BOT is most grateful to the past BOT for their focused efforts to put IIBA on firmer financial and programming ground. The BOT will continue to develop the richness of the IIBA community by supporting its members and promoting Bioenergetic Analysis to the larger psychotherapeutic community.

This will be done with the support of what has already been achieved by the precedent BOT: a balanced budget with savings to maintain our vitality as an institution, newly upgraded website (Webmaster: **Claude Thovex**) and the IIBA newsletter (Newsletter editor: **Mike Brennan**), an enhanced strategy of cooperation between societies, regions and IIBA, the possibility for societies to apply each year for project funds of up to 15% of their corresponding dues and an improved communication between the new Board of Trustees and the members of the IIBA.

The elections: The BOT revised the new procedure for voting online and found the outcome was satisfactory. The next phase will take place next year when three new members will join the BOT in a new election, one for each region.

The budget: In the annual meeting, the BOT revised carefully the budget for next year as we are very committed to make IIBA a sustainable organization.

Refund of the 15% dues for societies' projects: The money from IIBA dues will be refunded to every society that presents a project that is related to the spread of Bioenergetic Analysis or to the member's improvement as bioenergetics analysts. Each society or region will contact the IIBA administrator and present its project. A project can be presented every year.

IIBA web site: We remind you that you have access in the IIBA website to "members-only" information, which is quite valuable: documents of the IIBA, directory of members, Newsletters and IIBA budget information. We encourage you to use this site to announce your upcoming workshop and/or trainings. You can contact **Pilar Llobregat**, our Administrator, who can help you in posting information.

The 2013 Palermo Conference: The last IIBA International conference took place in Palermo last May. It was a great success and an important opportunity for the bioenergetics community to meet, share, exchange knowledge, experience and encounter members from other regions. It is the possibility to nourish ourselves as therapists.

The 2015 Recife Conference: The next International IIBA Conference will take place August 2015 in Brazil. Make place in your agendas for this event. The theme will be on love in the therapeutic relationship. You will receive in time more information about it.

Journal translations: It was accorded that every year the Journal will be translated into another language apart from English on a rotating basis. The rotation will start with the translation into Portuguese and every year it will be a different language to facilitate access to members who do not understand English well.

IIBA in China

In December of 2013, Michael Brennan and I gave a five day "Introduction to Bioenergetic Analysis Workshop" in Beijing, China. We had 33 participants from many parts of China.

They learned about the workshop through their social media. Their enthusiastic curiosity and receptivity was astounding to us. Each member of the group came to the workshop with various levels of therapeutic sophistication. They had backgrounds which included dance therapy, psychoanalysis, Yalom group therapy training, and cognitive therapy to name a few.

The goal of conducting this workshop was to stimulate enough interest to form the first certification training program in Bioenergetic Analysis in China. It pleases me to say that our efforts were successful. As a result, we now have two training programs scheduled to begin in April, one in Beijing and one in Shanghai.

This was a collaborative effort that began in June of 2012. Danita Hall from NY was the first contact with professor and psychotherapist ZhangMing during a personal trip to Beijing in 2012. She got the ball rolling. Ulrich Sollman of Germany also met with ZhangMing while he was in Beijing for a presentation at a conference in the spring of 2013.



In my role as IIBA Chair of Teaching, I continued to work with ZhangMing throughout 2012 and 2013 culminating in that first workshop in December.

I feel excited and appreciative of everyone who has been involved in this venture that is resulting in Bioenergetic Analysis Therapy and Training expanding into Asia.

PDW 2014 – Fuenterrabia, Gipuzkoa in Spain

The next PDW will be held in Fuenterrabil, Gipuzkoa, Spain, near San Sebastian this coming **October 14-19**.

The theme of the workshop is Archaic Issues: Energetic and Relational Aspects. This workshop will focus on working with primitive states before language carries meaning. The staff scheduled for this workshop is Scott Baum (USA), Vita Heinrich-Clauer (Europe) and Rebeca Berger (SA) with Susan Kanor (US) as the fourth if we have enough participants. Each of these trainers brings a wealth of information and experience working with these primitive issues.

Psychotherapeutic work with people who have suffered chronic relational trauma early in life requires an understanding of the effects of that early experience in all aspects of life. This PDW will concentrate on the understanding of the somatopsychic structures that develop under these conditions as well as on the particular demands on the Bioenergetic therapist working with people in states of fragmentation, primitive defenses, disturbed attachment and relationship dynamics that result from this early experience.

This is a great place to meet colleagues from around the world, share knowledge and network. It is also a place to improve your therapeutic skills, to be observed for certification as a CBT or to move toward a position of supervisor, local faculty or IIBA faculty.

Texas Training Bioenergetic Therapists for 33 Years

The Dallas Society for Bioenergetic Analysis (DSBA) is proud to announce that we have been awarded the recognition of *Mature Society* by International Institute for Bioenergetic Analysis (IIBA). The Dallas Society has been officially training Bioenergetic therapists for 33 years. Eleanor Greenlee was DSBA's Coordinating Trainer from January 1981 until 2009 when Eleanor turned the reins of leadership over to Chuck Lustfield. In June 2013 when Rick Spletter was invited to become an International Trainer, he assumed the role of IIBA Coordinating Trainer.

The Dallas Society for Bioenergetic Analysis (DSBA) has a very dedicated group of 11 trainees this year who are all showing significant growth. We have a very demanding training program. DSBA's training program is a "one-room schoolhouse" by design because we feel that all levels of training need to hear the information multiple times. The more advanced students are able to learn more as they answer questions from the newer students, and we put them in advanced situations where we expect more. One of our main formats is doing triad therapy sessions assigned by the trainers. Each triad stays consistent throughout the training year. They each rotate and play the role (therapist, client, and consultant) almost every weekend. We require reading assignments prior to training weekends, at least 24 hours of individual therapy during the training year and we are careful in determining if a student is ready for their "final year". We feel we have high standards for becoming a CBT and for becoming a local trainer/supervisor. We are proud of the many CBTs who have graduated over the years and who have continued to offer Bioenergetics as a core of their therapy practices.

Bioenergetics Program in Perm, Russia

2014 is a final year of training for the first group in Perm (our trainers: Hugo Steinmann, Vita Heinrich-Clauer, Heiner Steckel; our therapists: Angela Irslinger and Olaf Trapp). Hugo, the Godfather of the project, arrived in Perm with an introductory workshop in distant 2007.

In the beginning there were a lot of hopes and expectations. However, the activities on the new territory were like those of a landing force, when only a few veterans of the original force remained. The group has overcome many difficult situations: expected ones as well as those which were impossible to foresee.

The two deaths, one by one, of the women-participants of the group - Olga and Oksana - were a shock (with a long-term influence on the dynamics of the group). We cannot forget those whom we lost. The reality around us was also quite harsh. In fact, at that time there were two of the greatest catastrophes in the history of Perm with mass casualties: the crash of Boeing-737 (2008) and the fire in the club "Lame Horse" (2009). Then, in the beginning of our training, the members of our group carried out a difficult, but very necessary work with the family members of the deceased and on rehabilitation of the victims.

Our experience of training and care about ourselves deserves an epic Saga. Support of trainers and therapists always meant a lot for us, but the group was able to overcome difficulties and losses, to keep its own spirit and to include new members largely thanks to self-support and self-organization. I admire the existential courage of my friends and colleagues, their sense of humor and dedication to our work. I am grateful to my trainers for their trust and patience. They were quite ready for our extensive loving, passion and curiosity, reaching an aspiration to disembowel our teachers. As a matter of fact, some of them had to save themselves on the ceiling. But of far greater challenge were our creative suggestions and non-trivial solutions. After another "Russian surprise" we could read the movement of a thought: "My God, in what world am I?! They are crazy!" It seems, however, our enrichment was mutual. Those who are only going to Russia should know that a decent Russian wedding is not complete without fatal revelations, fights and reconciliation.

As for us, within these 7 years in the group we have been imbued with the understanding of the fact that professional maturity does not come according to a plan, like a train according to a schedule. Such a long training course has given us an experience that we can evaluate only now. Today is the time, when one project is nearing its completion, and plans for the further development are still being considered.



The members of the group are thinking about what the training has brought to us, what has changed in our personal and professional lives over the years. This understanding takes place not only in a deep self-reflection and feedback response from the body. Our environment helps us to understand it all: in relationship with our close people and our clients, with our colleagues and our new friends. Now we have only begun our public professional activities in the field of bioenergetics: translation of literature and preparing it for publication, scientific and educational exchanges with doctors and friendly contacts with the Moscow training group.

And of course, the members of the group are preparing for certification. There's a lot of excitement and jokes on this subject, and this year promises to be full of productive work. Dear friends, let us just deliver pleasure to ourselves!

Summer Workshops

These small work/playshops (for four to six people) take place at a magnificent seaside setting - 1.5 hours from the two New York airports and two hours from Manhattan.

Each participant receives an individual session each day. For five days a healing synergy occurs when we leave the environment that most of us have engineered to support our dysfunctional selves. That synergy is fed as one becomes a member of a group that bears witness to and shares each other's struggle. This safe and nurturing environment is a healing place for imbedded trauma.




EDITORIAL CONCLUSION
